From Fr. Bill

“Why do they want a copy of our child’s baptismal certificate?”

Baptism is the sacrament which brings one into God’s family. The church at which this occurs is in a sense your “mother church.” For the remainder of your life, all records that Catholic’s keep will be sent to the church of your baptism.

When your child receives their First Communion, we let their church of their baptism know for your child’s records. When they are confirmed, we let their mother church know when... and by whom they were confirmed. If someone takes vows to become a religious sister or brother, the information is sent to the church of their baptism. If someone is ordained a deacon, priest or bishop, the data is sent their mother church along with who ordained them. And if or when you get married in a Catholic Church, the church of your baptism is sent the information.

My mother is big into genealogy and she loves the record keeping practices of the Catholic Church. Names of godparents and witnesses as well as dates and places give her a treasure-trove of information following our family to the 1620’s in Quebec and pointing back to France.

Please know that confessions are not documented. We do not record the who, when and where of this sacrament as it is not anybody else’s business regarding who and why I am going to receive this sacrament. The priest has an obligation to keep the sacramental seal... never revealing the who and what of any person’s confession.

If you are getting married, being ordained a deacon or making vows as a religious sister or brother, you will be asked to provide a “recent” copy (within the last six months) of your baptismal certificate. This is a “Catholic Background Check.” Of course, as an infant you were not married to someone else... nor a priest nor a religious. The recent copy from your mother church reveals if you are free to make this commitment or have a prior commitment that prevents you from making this step. For these sacraments and commitments, the church also seeks the testimony of two individuals (parents, family or life-long friends) who can witness to the fact that you really are the person you are claiming to be... before taking marriage or religious vows, or before you are ordained to deaconate.

One of our newly confirmed, last May, was baptized at Holy Ghost Catholic Church in Detroit. Even though the parish no longer exists, its records continue to be kept up to date by the parish which is now responsible for that part of the city

of Detroit. We also discovered that one of our adults who was being prepared for confirmation... had already been confirmed. (Please note that in the churches of countries founded by Spain and Portugal... the Iberian Rite of the Catholic Church... it is not unusual at baptism for even infants to be confirmed.)

We do have challenges with some people baptized in Nigeria. Churches and records have sometimes been destroyed by Muslims seeking to exert control over parts of the country. When records can no longer be checked and verified by the church or diocese of baptism... the testimony of the two life-long eyewitnesses becomes more significant.

This is why we ask you to provide a copy of your child’s baptismal certificate for enrollment into First Communion and Confirmation programs.

I will be away the last week of August at a Convocation for the Priests of the LA Diocese. I am looking forward to the presentations and contributions to be given by Father Ron Rolheiser. Ron, who is a Roman Catholic priest and member of the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate, is president of the Oblate School of Theology in San Antonio, Texas. Ron is a community-builder, lecturer and writer. His Catholic Spirituality books are popular throughout the English-speaking world and his weekly column is carried by more than seventy Catholic newspapers worldwide.

The priests of Los Angeles, along with our bishops, will together be having daily mass as well as praying together the Liturgy of the Hours. (Priests and deacons are obliged to pray for the church each day. The Liturgy of the Hours [Morning Prayer, Midday Prayer, Evening Prayer, Night Prayer and the Office of Readings] are the means we use to make holy the entire day and to assist us in praying for the church. Full transparency, we do Morning and Evening Prayer together with the other ‘Hours’ done privately.) Additional opportunities of prayer, reflection, adoration and community building (including golf) will be offered.

Fr. Valentine is a guest priest (not a priest of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and promised in obedience to his bishop in Nigeria) so while I am away, he will be able to provide needed sacraments here at St. Jerome. Some parishes will have no masses or sacraments this week (Monday afternoon through Thursday night). Religious order priests, such as Jesuits, Franciscans and Salesians as well as other guest priests will be assisting in a few parishes and hospitals.

Please do keep your priests in prayer as you remain in ours.

Missionary Cooperative Collection

Next weekend, August 17th & 18th, **Fr. Benny**, CMI, representing the religious order of **Carmelite of Mary Immaculate** will be preaching at all masses sharing with us the stories of the missionary work as part of Missionary Cooperative Plan of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.

CMI is a missionary community started in India in 1831 by St. Kuriakos Chavara. St. John's CMI province of which Fr. Benny belongs situates in North India.
