From Fr. Bill

Occasionally I encounter someone rejoicing at a group or individual's misfortune. Envy, feeling that "they" have something "they" don't deserve, but I or my group should possess often plays a part in this attitude. Self-righteousness (pride) and looking down on "them" is involved. Anger and my wanting "them" punished for what I am jealous of, is also a component. All that is missing is lust, sloth and gluttony to get all seven deadly sins in this one behavior.

I need to work on a better response than being surprised at someone's apparent glee at another's pain or distress. And that they somehow believe I will be rejoicing with them at the news is a millstone around my neck. I usually discover the words I should have spoken later. This reflection is involved in my finding these words.

That someone else is blessed or happy, should be cause for rejoicing, not envy. When someone shares good news with us and I feel a piece of me die, envy is at work. (You're getting married? You're having a baby? You got a promotion? Your prodigal son gets a party dining on the fattened calf while you've never even given me a goat to share with my friends!) I am thankful that most real friends will catch themselves and use appropriate guilt to force a smile and share words to mirror the joy they don't yet really feel. Because of our friendship and love, I learn to embrace God's grace and live in my friend's joy. Envy reveals my hopes, desires and disappointments. How I respond to envy reveals if I belong to the Lord or the world.

And misfortunes? Many Christians view certain events which happen in the world as God's judgment: God's attempt to give someone or people a "wake-up call." Heart-attacks, cancer, or a near death experiences can help transform people's lives. The Catholic author, Mary Flannery O'Connor (1925-1964), referred to these situations as the grotesqueness of grace: that in dying to ourselves in one way, we are given the chance for insight and a transformed way of living. Yet, if Christians are rejoicing at the harm or misfortune of another, even if it may lead to conversion, I find this sad. And those who seem giddy at karma apparently slapping someone else down? Their behavior is at best, disappointing, and at worst, outright evil.

Stuff does happen in this world. These situations give us opportunities to witness: studying, praying and serving. Adversity does give us the opportunity to reveal our quality and character while acting to make God's love more visible. Bad stuff gives us the chance to make a difference and let God's light shine. These are opportunities to open our

hearts, hands and voices in support... not time for laughter, finger-wagging and derision. Kicking people when they are down may feel good but reaching out my hand to help raise them up, does good. Remember whatever you do to the least (and those goats being sent away didn't recognize Jesus in those they encountered, either) you do unto me.

We all have people who drive us nuts and make us a little crazy. And there are some who we may feel rise to the level of being an enemy, with ill intent toward us or those we love. Yet, Jesus is clear about His expectation for His disciples: "I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that? And if you greet only your own people, what are you doing more than others? Do not even pagans do that?" (Matthew 5:44-47)

Praying for someone's conversion is excellent. (We all need that.) Asking for pain and suffering upon another isn't something Jesus would want upon the lips of any of His followers. We are called to ask for God's blessing on them. Aren't they also made by our heavenly Father? Didn't Jesus give up His life for them as well? Aren't I challenged to love them as Jesus has loved me?

I understand resentment and wrath, but they are not Christian qualities. When one finds joy in the pain, loss and suffering of others... I must question if Christ is truly present in their life. When envy and anger own one's heart, there is no room for God. If I am unable to develop pity and compassion for others (especially for family and friends and even for enemies), I have much work needed in prayer, confession and perhaps counseling to soften my heart of stone.

This Prayer of St. Francis is more about what it means to be like our heavenly Father: "Lord make me an instrument of your peace: Where there is hatred let me sow love; Where there is injury, pardon; Where there is doubt, faith; Where there is despair, hope; Where there is darkness, light; And where there is sadness, joy. O divine master grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console..."

Just as my going into a garage doesn't mean I am a car, so going into a church doesn't mean that I yet truly belong to Christ. I need to be intentional about putting on Christ, taking up my cross and following Him. We each need to allow the Divine Physician to work on our deformed hearts. How I respond to the joys and sorrows of others reveals who is dwelling in my heart. I pray we are in His and He is in mine.
