From Fr. Bill

Recently a concerned grandparent shared with me what their grandchild was being taught concerning religion by their public-school teacher: "Religion is a means of controlling and oppressing people." Sadly, from things I have heard that have been taught at some universities, it wouldn't surprise me in the least that some younger teachers could not but be infected by the freedom "From Religion" attitudes prevalent at some public institutions.

At the convocation I was in a small group with the priest who is chaplain at USC. He shared with us that the students at USC who identified themselves as Catholic would put the seminarians to shame by their public commitment to the church, its teachings and the sacraments. They support one another, pray together daily, encourage each other and work to reach out to their peers who are struggling with the empty narcissism, tech-centered isolation and shallow reasons for life. "They know that they are made for so much more."

He doesn't take credit for this culture of faith which is present. Although he encourages it, he knows that it is the example and faith of their parents and grandparents which laid the foundations. They seem well educated in the faith and have come from homes where faith is an each-day kind of thing.

I am glad to know through our young people like Ijeoma, Lara, Hannah and Emily (young adults who have been heavily involved at St. Jerome) that the adversity experienced in college can actually strengthen a believer's resilience and faith. Still, I credit their families and especially their parents for laying strong foundations.

Parents are the primary educators. Children learn from what we do more than from what we tell them to do. Priests, catechists, youth ministers, and our catholic school teachers have the responsibility to help parents keep the promises made at baptism and to ensure that their children learn to know, love and serve the Lord in this world and, God willing, be happy with Jesus in the next life.

The Finance Council challenged me to put my time, skill and energy into teaching the children at our St. Jerome School the Catholic faith. Part of this suggestion was the practical point that we needed cut expenses and I work for dog treats. Additionally, they know I've been a teacher for 24 years and that I truly believe in the importance of educating our children in an anti-god culture and that our children are the future of our church. I am

now the middle school religion teacher. I promise to do my best to not only have our children know about what Christians believe, I will strive by word and example to guide them to live as Christians. I am thankful that our enrollment is currently nine more than last year and am hopeful that the good word of what's happening at our parish and school becomes better known. Your prayers are appreciated.

This weekend we will be blessing our catechists, youth ministers and teachers as they begin the new school year in contributing their time, talents and energy in serving the Lord Jesus. The blessings will be at the morning masses this weekend and the 5:30pm Sunday mass next weekend.

Speaking of catechists and teaching the faith, if you or someone you love is interested in becoming Catholic have them come to the 11am Sunday Mass and join with other adults who are learning about Christ and His church. If you are a Catholic adult but haven't yet been Confirmed or received your First Communion, join us and let's make this happen! We sit in the first row right in front of where the scriptures are read. Don't let fear keep you from discovering the path to forgiveness and a purposeful, meaningful way of life.

On the last weekend of September, we will begin celebrating St. Jerome's 70th Anniversary as a parish! A breakfast will be available that morning. We will have the chance to renew acquaintances and build friendships. The Anniversary Books will be distributed to those who had their pictures taken. Opportunities to learn about and get involved in ministries and service radiating from St. Jerome will also be available. Please note that a section of the parking-lot (at the bottom of the church stairway by the rectory) will be unavailable that morning. I apologize for an inconvenience this may cause.

The 40 Days for Life begins September 25th. We will be having a guest speaker in October from FosterAll to walk the talk in our efforts to support human life from womb to the tomb. Both young and old deserve respect and a life with quality and meaning. Remember that we never retire from being the children of God, but we do need to adjust and adapt to our changing circumstances. In our later years the Spiritual Works of Mercy grow in significance and importance: Counseling the doubtful, Instructing the ignorant, Admonishing the sinner, Comforting the sorrowful, Forgiving injuries, Bearing wrongs patiently, Praying for the living and the dead. Interceding for others isn't just a thing saints do in heaven; it is something we begin doing for each other on earth.
