## From Fr. Bill

Fear sells. Stay tuned.

“But, Father, why hasn’t this been on TV?”

Keep in mind that the media’s objective is to get viewers in order to sell your eyes and ears to advertisers. Good stories are a higher priority than accuracy. Also, media companies know that crisis encourage “keeping up” with the latest opinions and updates.

Here is the data and facts which have remained constant in spite of all the hype and anxiety I seem to see on television. I can’t help wonder why my family and friends from Seattle to San Diego don’t seem to be experiencing what the media suggest is common in their neighborhoods. (If you are spending your time watching a cruise ship dock in Oakland, you should consider taking more walks, calling/visiting family or friends and of course spending more time in prayer.)

Yes, I come from a family of people in the medical and insurance fields. Yes, I read the Center for Disease Control (CDC) reports. Yes, I know that panic and fear often cause more harm than the most current disease entering our awareness. (80’s HIV and AIDs, 2000’s SARS, and 2010’s Ebola... just to name a few.) Keeping perspective is important.

Peace be with you.

Worldwide the Corona Virus mortality rate for those 40 or younger is apparently 0.2% which is 2 out of every 1,000... which in the United States is lower than your likelihood in giving birth to twins and more than your likelihood in getting hit by a meteorite. Almost all of these Corona Virus deaths involve people with other health complications and respiratory issues. For context, please note that your likelihood of dying in any year, by any cause in the United States is 0.7% ... so yes, currently 7 out of every thousand people die each year just because.

For those in their 50’s and 60’s the current Corona Mortality rate is 2.4% which is about 2 ½ out of every one hundred with CONFIRMED CASES. (This means the illness was bad enough to get you to see your doctor or go to the hospital.) These are the odds in the United States of a family with children having both biological and adopted children or the odds of a child living with at least five siblings or the odds of a child having one of

their parents in prison. Again, most of these Corona Virus deaths involve people with other health complications and respiratory issues.

Worldwide to date no children 10 or younger have yet died due to the Corona Virus. For your consideration, in the United States alone 136 children have died this winter from the flu.

The main groups at risk continue to be those over 80 years of age who contract the Corona Virus (21% mortality rate, that is 1 out of 5) and those over 70 years of age (8% mortality rate, that is 1 out of 12). Please note that most of these deaths are people who are heavy smokers (China, Iran and Italy) as well as living in countries where the government medicine programs ration and restrict health resources in favor of those under 60 years of age. The availability of respiratory treatments available in the United States (rather than as in China putting these people into isolation) would most likely lower... but, of course, not eliminate the mortality rate.

Sadly, the Corona Virus symptoms are similar to flu symptoms and so a child, teen or healthy adult may not have an experience worse than coughing, fever and respiratory congestion. Please know that most children, teens and previously healthy adults seem to recover well.

Panic and distress do little good. Rather good hygiene and common sense are always a good starting point. Secondly, if you are sick with a cold, flu or virus... please respect and protect the elderly and most at risk by staying home, if at all possible.

Smokers and those with lung/respiratory conditions and diseases will likely need special attention and care. The Corona Virus loves heavy smokers. Maybe this is a good motivation to quit smoking?

Do wash your hands often, especially after going to the bathroom or before eating. If you choose to use hand sanitizer, make sure it has AT LEAST 60% alcohol content to be effective.

Do avoid touching your own eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.

Cover your cough. Do sneeze with tissue. Also, don’t carry around your soiled tissue. Please dispose of it in a covered trash can.

Be not afraid, but do use common sense.
