Not all funeral services are the same. She had made her children promise to hold a Catholic service for her... and that her children attend.

It was quickly evident that although her children had attended St. Jerome School, that somehow “practicing Catholic” hadn’t stuck. I’m sure they felt they had good reasons for leaving the church. I’m sure they felt they had good reasons to not raise their children Catholic. The low response on the words of the Our Father and non-responses to “The Lord be with you” suggested it wasn’t just the Catholic Church they had left behind.


Her grandchildren seemed very interested in what I had to say while her children nodded in recognition at the familiar truths we hold. They thanked me when we finished. I was watering seeds I believe their mother and grandmother had planted.

I believe her decision to make her children promise to have that service was her “Hail Mary” final play on this earth to try to bring her children home to Jesus and the church she loved. I hope I fulfilled her prayers and helped them hear and receive the message. We plant seeds. Others water, fertilize, bring sunshine and harvest. We each can make a difference. We each do have a part to play. I know God hasn’t and doesn’t give up on His children even when they stray. He will continue until our last breath to reach out with loving forgiveness and seek to bring us into His Kingdom, His Home.

I believe she continues to intercede for her family. Who knows? You might be the answer to her prayer to bring her children and grandchildren home. It worked for St. Monica whose prayers were answered by St. Ambrose, a man who had given up all the power and privilege of being the governor of Aemilia-Liguria (Milan and northern Italy) that Augustine’s father had held as the governor of Numidia (modern Algeria with sections of Tunisia and Libya)... to be baptized and become Catholic. Augustine discovered a man who had found what fills the hungering emptiness of the human heart. “Our hearts are restless until they rest in thee.” It wasn’t Ambrose’s preaching that converted Augustine. It was the choices he had made and how he was living a loving, generous, joy-filled life which convicted the young man who had tired to make it “All about ME.”

We are the witnesses and as Jesus’ disciples we continue to have the opportunity each day to give testimony by how we live life to help bring others to Jesus and help prayers to be answered. God alone knows what act of kindness or compassion may open someone’s heart to the truth. St. Monica and other mothers continue to pray for their lost children. Be aware that God may bring you the opportunity to be the answer to their prayer.

We need to be knocking down those mountains and filling in those valleys until the Lord has found a way to enter each and every person’s heart: Prepare the Way.
