From Fr. Bill

Padre Pio... I was in the seminary with his nephew before I had a clue regarding who he was. He was studying for the Franciscans and I, the Salesians. He was a nice kid who was aware that he represented his uncle (whom he was named after) and the church. He had a gentleness and sense of peace that I admired. I don't know if those were qualities he shared with his uncle, but I do know that September 23rd is the feast of Saint Padre Pio and is also the beginning of our Annual **40 Days for Life**.

"PRAYER & FASTING: Christ told us some demons can only be driven out by prayer and fasting. The two go hand in hand. Prayer keeps us rooted in the fact that it is our desire to carry out God's will. Fasting is a sacrifice that helps us reach beyond our own limitations with God's help."

"CONSTANT VIGIL: The visible, public centerpiece of 40 Days for Life is a focused, 40-day, non-stop, round-the-clock prayer vigil outside a single Planned Parenthood center or other abortion facility in your community."

God knows America needs prayer. Additionally fasting can be a helpful discipline to help us practice sayings no to things for the sake of our commitment to the Lord.

Speaking of prayer and America's need for it... on 10-10 we will be hosting a special time of prayer with our Blessed Mother (America Needs Fatima) before the Blessed Sacrament. I spent all those years praying the Rosary for the conversion of Russia and China and world peace. Too bad that I presumed America did not need conversion which is now so blatantly obvious.

On Saturday, October 10th immediately following the 8am mass and beginning of adoration we will begin praying for ourselves, our country and the world. We need Jesus so much and our Blessed Mother is a great role model and guide to her Son, "Do whatever He tells you to do." The Rosary and Litany of Our Blessed Mother will be a part of our program of prayer which should be finishing around 10am. You need not be Catholic too attend as all believers should be uniting in prayer for our country which so much needs Christ's peace and healing.

Last Sunday I posted this on the bulletin's front cover which caused splash-back: *Welcome Back From Vacation! Yes, we know casinos are opened and that churches in Orange County are open. Yes, we know that many states and most countries have opened their churches. Welcome to Los Angeles! Mass is being held outside because we are not allowed inside churches in Los Angeles.*

The unspoken context for this is the number of people returning from vacation wondering why our St. Jerome had been "RE-closed" when their trips had been to places which seem to have moved on from being controlled by anxiety and opened restaurants, casinos and churches.

Some felt that my use of the word "casino" suggested I was stating that casinos were opened in LA and let me know that the bulletin had a factual error. Truth be told, I have never considered what LA calls casinos (No slots? No roulette? No shows? No way!) to actually BE casinos. I was sharing what these vacationers had experience which I presumed to be Vegas and "Native American gaming enterprises" (a.k.a. Indian Casinos). Heck, if I tried to arrange a Senior Center Trip to one of those establishments, I would be roundly mocked. I apologize for not realizing that some people consider "card clubs" to actually be casinos.

Speaking of our Senior Center... isolation kills. Please keep our seniors in prayer and especially those locked down because of fear of covid. Don't forget your senior neighbors and friends. "It is not good for man to be alone." People do need people and there is a huge difference between just being alive and truly living. Be prudent, but do help the vulnerable and isolated know that you remember and care for them.

The Feast of Saint Jerome is Wednesday, September 30th.

It is hard to believe how much things have changed since last year's feast and our celebrating 70 years of our Saint Jerome Church.

I just about jumped out of my skin when a saint gave me a call to say that she and her husband wanted to help one of our Catholic families with their school tuition. I am grateful to this couple and hope that others may step forward and assist our children.

With an average tuition of \$6,000 per child (for the year) many families wanting a Catholic education need your help. We have one family that requires \$250 per month (\$2,500 for the year), two families that need \$200 (\$2,000 for the year), three families that need \$150 (\$1,500 for the year) and nine families that need \$100 (\$1,000 for the year). As I did last year, I am anonymously helping a family with tuition. I believe in the importance of Catholic Education.

Please help our children. Please help our families who do sacrifice much to give ~~their children~~ **OUR CHILDREN** the education they need and deserve. Thank you for prayerfully considering this need in our parish community. They are our children and our future. Please help them get the Catholic education these children truly need and deserve. Thank you.

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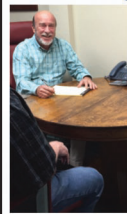
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
