From Fr. Bill

"Will you still need me? Will you still feed me when I'm sixty-four?" I will find out this week.

Birthdays: although when I was younger I believed birthdays were about parties and gifts. Since forty I have come to realize they are days to remember, express gratitude and honor those I will always be indebted to... as I can only payforward this love in appreciation for the loving and patient sacrifices they have offered for me.

In an age when the greatest threat to a child's life may be their parents having them executed in an abortion, I am grateful to my parents saying "yes" to each other and God and helping bring me into this world. I will never fully know all that they have done for me but each year reveals to me more of the compassion and sacrifices they gave for me and my siblings. I know I drove them to prayer. I know that at times I caused them anxiety and tears. I am blessed by their consistent prayer and the love they continue to show for each other.

Although I usually focus on my grandparents, my uncles, aunts, friends and teachers... this year my brothers and sisters are filling my mind and heart.

I am thankful that I was first born (and spoiled by grandparents) and for my three sisters and my brother. Mary is my oldest sister. She is a Cal Tech graduate. She has a Masters Degree in some kind of Chemistry. She is more powerfully a wife and mother of at least five. Mary is the one who I fought with as a child and at times drove nuts but over the years have grown to deeply appreciate and respect the amazing woman she is. By the way, some people suggested that she was going to be a nun and that I was going to be a sports writer or broadcaster. They whiffed on both of those predictions.

Laura is my middle sister. A better than average student Laura fell victim to being compared by teachers to her older siblings who were toward the top of their classes. Where I was considered the musical failure of our family, Laura, with only a bachelors degree, carried the burden of never working up to her potential. (I know that teachers are important but it doesn't mean they are always right... and they misjudged her badly.) Laura has the ability to be with anyone, help them to feel comfortable and leaving them feeling like they had been life-long friends. She too is a wife and mother of at least five. Not that my mother didn't shine in the kitchen, but Laura seems to have gotten the best of both my

grandmothers' cooking skills. When she prepares a meal I can sense my grandmothers' presence in the food and its presentation.

My brother Bob is next. Although we shared a bedroom, being eight years apart, we were never in the same school together nor in a sense in the same family. By eighth grade I was gone most summers involved in Boy Scouts and working at Camp Don Bosco in Arrowbear, California. Bob had to deal with our sisters while I was busy with high school and Christian Service. Bob got his Bachelors in Electrical Engineering at UCLA and his Masters in Business at USC. I really got to know my brother, his generosity and dry wit (humor) at my parent's fiftieth wedding anniversary. I was unaware the man he had become. (Please note I moved away from my family during my senior year of high school as I began following my vocation as priest and educator.) Bob is a gentleman and a loving husband. When I see him, I see my dad.

My baby sister, Margaret, was last. My mom had decided to give away all her baby stuff and God laughed. I am grateful that I was able to teacher her guitar on my vacations with my parents. I will never forget singing church songs with her the month before her death. The music seemed to bring back her memories and her awareness that the brain tumor seemed to have taken away. Margaret was an LMU undergrad (I crashed at her apartment during my summer study programs at LMU) and then went to Cal Davis and got a Double Masters in Mathematics and Chemistry. When Margaret's brain cancer went into remission for a couple of years, she ended up teaching chemistry at Port Hueneme High School. As I was associate pastor in neighboring Ventura, during those two years I was blessed to have more time with her as a adult than I did my other siblings. Her death at fortytwo left an empty-space that I know her husband and three children have had to bear.

"Though I know I'll never lose affection for people and things that went before. I know I'll often stop and think about them. In my life I love you more." Thank you, Jesus, for loving me and bringing these I love, especially my friends and family here at St. Jerome, into my life.

I don't think I have told them, but I am proud of my siblings. I am grateful that God brought each of them into my life. I encourage you as well to focus on your blessings. Living a thank-filled and grateful life brings with it that sense of peace that Christ and the Eucharist offer us each day. Trust Him. He gives us what we truly need.


